The members of the United Nations agree to accept and carry out The decisions of the Security Council in accordance with this letter. Security Council has five permanent members (Grand -gretan, China, France, Russia and United States) and 10 members elected by the Assembly General that work for two terms (Currently Angola, Bulgária, Camerites, Chile, Germany, Guinea, Mexico, Pakistan, Spain and Syria). Historically, this organization was developed to encourage all the allies of World War II to participate in the new united nations when it was forming. It is important to say, it is necessary to obtain nine members of the Security Council to agree. However, the five permanent members have the power of veto, and any of them can block any resolution of the Security Council. The smaller nations in the Security Council often fall into extremely uncomfortable positions à è - that can force them to vote for certain ways. This action may include demonstrations, blockages and other operations by means of a region, marble or land of the members of the United Nations.
